
#### A Progress Report - Robin Norrie GSCA chair

Three Years ago, trustees set out to change the Community Association's legal structure to a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO) and reform the constitution with members' approval at the 2022 AGM. (See the Guilden Sutton website for information about CIOs, becoming a trustee and the advantages).

The current trustees have been busy improving the village hall by fixing the roof, modernising the toilets, installing a solar energy system and many other minor works to repair and improve the hall. It is tempting to think that the job is done but the Community Association is more than just bricks and mortar. At its heart are its members and volunteers who bring people together

#### Fox Meadow Update March 2025

When the wildflower project was first imagined, none of us thought it

would take three years to complete, but we've got there in the end thanks to the support of members of the local community, Guilden Sutton Parish Council, our CW&C borough councillors and the efforts of the Wildflower Group committee.

Thank you to GSPC for providing a grit bin at the top of the steps. We will be planting more annuals in April to bring more colour throughout the patch. There is a planter to assemble and install near the lamppost, which we hope will be used to grow herbs for people to use, and a small seat in the middle of the garden. We hope to put a few stepping stones by the noticeboard too. If anyone would like to help with the wildflower seed sowing

Apologies to the faeries who planted the little Christmas tree in December as we will have to remove it. We only have permission to plant one fruit tree, and everything in the garden has to be native species. If anyone has any ideas for the garden, please bring them to the committee first so that we don't contravene the terms of the licence.

We will arrange a modest official opening ceremony once the planter and seat are installed and the flowers bloom, probably in May or June. Everyone will be welcome. Now the daffodils are coming out we know Spring is on its way and the wildflowers won't be far behind
